

The City of Tucson – Community Services Department manages a variety of housing assistance programs:

Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program – qualified applicants are issued a voucher and may rent from any private landlord who accepts the Section 8 Program. **We are not accepting applications at this time.** General program information on the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program can be accessed at our website: www.tucsonaz.gov/csd/housing

Public Housing – 1500 units owned by the City of Tucson. Beginning 6/1/08, applications are continuously accepted for 0/1 bedroom (elderly and/or disabled only). Acceptance of applications for all other bedroom sizes is closed. Completed applications must be: mailed to Public Housing Waiting List, P.O. Box 27210, Tucson, AZ 85726; dropped off at the Applications Office, 310 N. Commerce Park Loop, or submitted online at www.tucsonaz.gov/publichousing. Also, applications will be available at the following Public Housing Zone offices: Tucson House (1501 N. Oracle Rd.), El Pueblo Center (101 W. Irvington Rd.), Clements Center (8123 E. Poinciana Dr.), and 4015 E. Fairmount St.

Project-based Housing (Moderate Rehabilitation) – privately owned complexes contracted with the City are currently accepting applications for one-bedroom units. An application may be obtained from the Housing Application Office, 310 N. Commerce Park Loop or mailed to you if so requested. The Housing Application Office phone number is (520) 791-4616.

El Portal Program – The City of Tucson owns these affordable single family homes and multi-unit properties. The units are available to anyone with a good credit history that meets appropriate income limits based on family size. The Metropolitan Housing Corporation has a low-income housing program – Posadas Sentinel Apartments. Waiting lists for 2, 3, and 4-bedrooms are available. The management office is located at 464 W.
