The loss of prop 200 was not because people hate police and fire protection but because we can not afford to pay more taxes. I can not understand why the government thinks it is so easy to override when we as homeowners and business people have to work within our budgets. We need to go back to basics with less government. Any good business when in trouble do their reductions from the top down. If certain reductions were made, then we could afford to have the 2.4 police per 1000. I hope that this election serves as a wake up call for the Mayor and City Council. Seek responsibility to your constituents and rid yourselves with the buddy buddy system.

Word from your Vice President - Joe Flores

Why was prop 200 & 400 defeated: Because people are tired of our taxes being raised due to governments reckless spending and High High wages. Thousands of residents have lost their jobs and homes within the last three years but the number of county and city employees earning more than \$100,000 a year has nearly doubled. In 2006, when the Arizona Daily Star reported that Tucson had more than 100 city staffers earning six-figure salaries, Pima County had just 76 employees in the 100K club. Today the county has 142 plus 1 that just joined, Mike Hein at \$110,000 per year and the city has 124 employees. Note that seven of the county's sheriff's sergeants not including captains and lieutenants and 35 City police officers belong to the 100K club. What we need is a mandate to prevent these high increased earnings. It is well known that the county and city have become top-heavy. Considering the average US Census wage to be \$54,000 per year. It should be where a person can live comfortably but not outrageously as **Mr. Huckelberry's salary of \$253,555.62** per year.

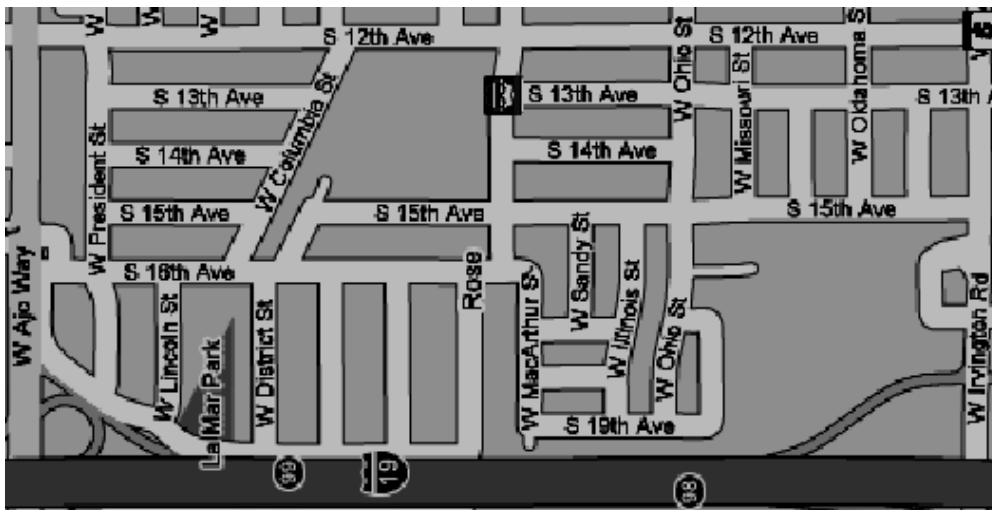
