Department: Department of Agriculture

Agency/Program: Forest Service – Wildland Fire Management (Bufflegrass Initiative)

Grant/Program Description: competitive grant

Distribution or Appointment of Formula:

\$500 million for wild fire prevention and mitigation activities:

- \$250 million for grant program that funds state and private lands' wildland fire management programs
- \$250 million for hazardous fuel reduction, forest health protection, rehabilitation and hazard mitigation activities on Federal lands

Direction:

- Provides flexibility to the Service to allocate funds among existing State and private assistance programs to choose programs that provide the maximum public benefit.
- Priority given to projects which create the most jobs.
- Allows the Service to use up to \$50,000,000 to make competitive grants for the purpose of creating incentives for increased use of biomass from federal and non-federal forested lands.
- No matching or cost share requirements.

- \$55,447 million has been allocated by DOE to the State of Arizona. Funding levels have not been finalized by the State for any of the six individual programs.

- Six program areas have been submitted by the State of Arizona to DOE for approval of ARRA State Energy Program funds. It appears, however, that the City's General Services Department is currently eligible for funding in only two of the programs listed and of those, the proposed "21st Century Energy" program grant may hold the highest potential for consideration. That program encourages and expands the use of solar PV on buildings, and bio fuels infrastructure in Arizona.
