3rd Street/University Bicycle Boulevard

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The 3rd Street/ University Bicycle Boulevard Projects goal is to improve the city’s most popular bike route and provide bicyclists of all ages and abilities with a safe and pleasant route to traverse the city from east to west. The route connects thousands of residents between Wilmot Road and Main Avenue to shopping, jobs, schools, and to several other bicycle friendly routes that easily reach the downtown, the river pathways and beyond.

Funding has been secured from the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) to install a bike/pedestrian signal at the Swan crossing and for additional traffic calming, wayfinding signage, intersection improvements, pavement markings, as well as changes to traffic control signage to help prioritize bike travel more. In addition, since about a half mile of the corridor lies within the planned Modern Street Car route, plans for a parallel lower stress route are being planned with this project along 5th Street. The open house will feature a presentation on Tucson’s Bicycle Boulevard network and will have the plans for this corridor available for viewing and comment.

PROJECT AREA

The project route stretches 7 miles from Main Avenue near downtown to Wilmot Road on the east side. From east to west it follows University Avenue, goes through U of A, then along 3rd Street and Rosewood Street.
