SEEKING CANDIDATES FOR 2016/2017 CTRA ELECTION OF OFFICERS “YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE”

CTRA Officers will be elected at the Annual Meeting on May 28, 2016.

Four CTRA EXECUTIVE BOARD members will be elected to provide leadership and support to the City of Tucson Retirees Association.

The momentum of any organization is powered by the energy and dedication of its members. The moving force behind the success of CTRA since the beginning in 1983 is volunteers providing leadership.

Members are encouraged to step up and volunteer your skills and a few hours of time each month to support the goals of the Association. The Executive Board meets each month, except June, July and August, on the third Wednesday of the month at the Parks and Recreation Therapeutic Center, 1000 S. Randolph Way, at 1:00 p.m. (NEW TIME!!!)

CTRA MEMBERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO VOLUNTEER TO SERVE ON THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

CTRA’s By-Laws provide for an Executive Board consisting of nine members: Four elected members (Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary), immediate past Chair, TSRS Retiree Representative and appointed Chairs of standing committees (Membership, Newsletter and Outreach).

Officers are elected for one-year terms. An ELECTED officer is limited to serving three one-year terms in the same elected position.

Each year, a Nominating Committee recommends a slate of candidates to run for the following elected positions:

Chair	Vice-Chair
Treasurer	Secretary

Volunteer candidates are needed to fill these four positions. Brief examples of duties and responsibilities for each position are listed below:

CHAIR - Provides leadership to the Executive Board and partners with the Executive Board in achieving organizational goals. The chair presides over Executive Board meetings, preparing monthly Board meeting agenda. The Chair appoints committee Chairs in consultation with other Board members, as needed. He/She helps guide Board actions with respect to CTRA's priorities.

VICE-CHAIR -Plans eight monthly CTRA luncheons and four special events (Annual meeting, Annual BBQ, Annual Thanksgiving Potluck and Annual Christmas luncheon). Performs other duties as assigned by the Board. The Vice-Chair stands in for the Chair when Chair is not available. He/She works closely with the Chair and other Executive Board members.

TREASURER - In general, the volunteer treasurer is responsible for keeping track of all the money that passes through CTRA and all the money it has at any given time. The Treasurer keeps track of deposits to and withdrawals from the Association's credit union account. The Treasurer prepares monthly financial reports for Executive Board meeting. The Treasurer also prepares annual financial report for CTRA's annual membership meeting. The Treasurer administers CTRA's Liability Insurance contracts. The Treasurer takes reservations for the two Annual Luncheons (May and December) for which members pay a reservation fee.

SECRETARY - Takes and transcribes minutes of Board meetings. Ensures minutes are distributed to Board. Maintains records of the Board meetings and ensures effective management of Association records.
