WHO CAN VOTE

To vote in the City of Tucson 2007 Primary Election:

- You must have resided in the City of Tucson since August 12th, and
- You must be registered to vote on or before August 13th, and
- You must be at least 18 years old on September 11th.

If you are registered as a member of the Democratic, Republican, Libertarian, or Green Party, you may vote in your party's Mayoral Primary Election. If you have lived in Ward 1,2, or 4 since August 12th, you may also vote in your party's Primary Election for Council Member in your Ward.

If you are registered as Independent, as No Party Preference, or as a member of a political party other than Democratic, Republican, Libertarian, or Green Party, you may vote in the Primary Election of the Democratic, Republican, Libertarian, or Green Party. Speak to an election official to get the ballot for the political party in which you wish to vote.

You may only vote in ONE party's Primary Election.

The names of the candidates who are nominated in the Primary Election will be on the General Election ballot in November. All qualified electors residing in the City of Tucson on or before October 7th (regardless of what Ward you reside in), who will be at least 18 years old on November 6th, and who have registered to vote by October 8th, may vote in the November 6th election.

WHERE TO VOTE

Polling Places change! **Check the mailing label on this pamphlet for where to vote.** If you require assistance, please call 791-3221 or TTY 791-2639 no later than 5 p.m., August 31. (The City does not provide transportation.)

WHEN TO VOTE

The polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day, September 11th. Any qualified elector standing in line to vote at 7 p.m., on September 11th, will be allowed to mark and cast their ballot.

VOTER'S RIGHTS

- Any voter may be accompanied into the voting booth by a person of the voter's choice, or by two election officials (one from each major political party).
- This pamphlet, "The Choice Is Yours", may be marked with your choices and taken into the voting booth.
- Qualified voters in line to vote at 7 p.m., on September 11, will be allowed to mark and cast their ballot.

REQUIRED IDENTIFICATION (ID) AT THE POLLS

State Law requires that every voter show proof of identity and address before receiving a ballot. The name and address on the ID must match the information on the voter registration list.

A voter who does not provide one form of identification from LIST 1 OR two different forms of identification from LIST 2 shall not be issued a regular ballot, but shall receive a provisional ballot and will have three business days after this Election to provide sufficient ID to the County Recorder in order for their provisional ballot to count. (ARS §16-579A)

LIST 1

Photo ID with name and address (need 1):

- Valid Arizona Driver's license or non-operating ID
- Tribal enrollment card with photo
- Valid US federal, state, or local government issued ID

LIST 2

ID without photo, with name and address (need 2):

- Utility bill of voter dated within 90 days of the date of election - electric, gas, water, solid waste, sewer, telephone, cell phone or cable.
- Bank or Credit Union statement dated within 90 days of the election
- Valid Arizona Vehicle Registration
- Indian Census Card
- Property tax statement of voter's residence
- Tribal enrollment card without photo
- Vehicle insurance card
- Valid US federal, state, or local government ID
- Voter Registration Card/ Recorder's Certificate
- Any "Official Election Material" bearing your name and address.

IF YOUR NAME IS NOT ON THE PRECINCT REGISTER:

On Election Day, speak to the election official in charge of the signature roster. You can vote in a precinct with a certificate from the Pima County Recorder, showing that you are entitled to vote in that precinct, or, if you believe you are entitled to vote in that precinct, you can vote a "provisional ballot". ***Your residence address must be located within the precinct in which you are attempting to vote. You must also sign an affirmation on the provisional ballot envelope, indicating that you are registered to vote in that precinct.***

EARLY VOTING

The last day to request an early ballot to be mailed is August 31st by 5 p.m.

**You may vote in person, at the following locations and times,
August 9th to September 7th (Closed September 3 for Labor Day):**

City Hall – 255 W. Alameda, First Floor - Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Wilmot Branch Library – 530 N. Wilmot Road – Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Friday 10 a.m to 5 p.m.

Saturday Early Voting - August 25 and September 1.
Wilmot Branch Library – 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

September 11, 2007 Election Day - The City Clerk must receive Early Ballots by 7 p.m. By law, ballots received after this time cannot be counted. On Election Day, ballots may be delivered to the City Clerk or to any City polling place from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS


- Use black or dark blue pen. (Do not use red ink.)

- If you make a mistake or damage the ballot, you must ask for a new ballot.


