Chair's Report (M. Higgins)

The Chair announces the recent passing of Harry Kressler, the person who established the CAPT 14 yrs ago. The Chair and L. Teyechea summarized his accomplishments in the community.

MAPIC:

The Chair reports she attended the MAPIC (Medicine Abuse Prevention Initiative Collaborative) in Phoenix last month and asks the CAPT to make this a priority/focus due to the importance of this issue. She will set up a meeting with A. Bass and Shana Malone. L. Teyechea reports that CPC might have funding for this project and is likely the lead in Pima County. Other counties have pilot projects already implemented. R. Tullgren was impressed with the previous MAPIC meeting he attended but wants to focus on Communities of Concern for prevention messaging.

M. Higgins states the CAPT has a 3 pronged focus: alcohol, prescription drugs and marijuana.

Marijuana:

M. Higgins brings up the issue of legalization. Suggests looking at the possibility of a tax for both medicinal and legalized marijuana.

RHBA:

CPSA lost the RHBA bid to Cenpatico. United Health is appealing on their behalf. The new contract begins October 1st, 2015. Cenpatico says they anticipate no changes for the first 90 days; prevention is expected to be different. There is a movement towards payment reform for mental health.

-The Chair requests a volunteer to take the lead on booking speakers for future meetings. L. Teyechea volunteers. There is a possibility of having someone from Cenpatico speak at the March meeting.

-The Chair also requests a volunteer to assist the secretary with meeting minutes; S. Salemi will take minutes and S. Clark will share this task as needed.

-No one volunteered to chair the Membership Committee. R. Tullgren suggests T. Donovan from COPE for CAPT membership.

1. **Policy Committee** - T. Tate, Chair

The Committee met today regarding the legalization of marijuana; it's a state issue and we are local though we can provide recommendations of the legislature. The Committee looked at CO, specifically Denver and noted the increase in arrests, ER visits. The state of CO has just released a report outlining the consequences they've experienced as a result of medical marijuana. The next report covers employer issues, and that the science isn't as clear for law enforcement to identify impairment.

T. Tate reports that Denver has both a legal and black market for marijuana and law enforcement has difficulty distinguishing between the two.

Discussion follows regarding what individual agencies/businesses are doing to deal with employees who use medical marijuana.

T. Tate encourages CAPT members to submit information/ideas.

They have also submitted the Answering the Call report (formerly known as the Call to Action). It will be previewed by the Executive Committee and finalized.

2. **TFRUD Committee**- S. Driscoll Salemi, Chair

-The Committee continues to work on a logo and will then order a table banner with the logo imprinted on it.

-They are drafting a guest editorial opinion piece.

-There is a brief nationwide Big Bowl survey of Super Bowl commercials.

3. **Communities of Concern**- L. Munguia, Chair

-S. Gorin spoke of his BUZZ alcohol prevention program and may provide programming for CPC.
