3. Discussion and Updates on Future Planning for the Human Relations Commission

Create a role within the Commission that would be responsible for informing the media about significant actions taken by the Commission and its subcommittees.

Develop and host a forum to discuss issues related to political asylum.

Develop a relationship with local nonprofit organizations that work in the area of human trafficking.

Develop educational and/or advocacy programs in support of Arizona signing on to the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and/or Tucson's adoption of The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women—a UN treaty not signed by the United States, but adopted by many cities within the United States.

Develop educational and/or advocacy programs about gun violence to be conducted, at least initially, in neighborhoods with high rates of gun-related injuries or deaths.

Develop educational and/or advocacy programs about the upcoming U.S. Census to include, but not be limited to:

- The importance of completing U.S. Census forms.
- Emphasizing the link between U.S. Census counts and federal funding to localities.
- Potential questions regarding the inclusion of the "citizenship question."

Discussion on possible written testimony of the Human Relations Commission to the United States Commission on Civil Rights (USCCR) regarding immigrant family separation and other subjects open for testimony before the USCCR.
