Cabrini Neighborhood Spring Clean – Saturday, March 27th, 2010

1. **Dumpster Available, 1-4pm** – A roll-off will be available in the parking lot on the northwest side of St. Francis Cabrini Church for all your spring cleaning needs. We would appreciate a canned food donation for the Community Food Bank for this service (*neighborhood volunteers will be available between 1-4pm to take your donation*).
2. **Neighborhood Cleanup Walk, 10am** – get to know your neighbors while cleaning up trash along our streets. Meet at the St. Francis Cabrini church on Presidio at 10am to participate in the Cleanup Walk, which will last about one hour.
3. **Household Hazardous Waste Drop off, Feldman's Neighborhood, 9am – 11:30am** - Feldman's Neighborhood invites Ward 3 residents to their Household Hazardous Waste Collection at the vacant lot on the SW corner of Park and Drachman. You may drop off hazardous household waste such as paint, varnish, petroleum products, insecticides, fluorescent light bulbs, and batteries other than regular alkaline AA, AAA, C, and D cells. We can only accept petroleum products in sealed containers of 5 gallons or less.
4. **Neighborhood Yard Sale, early morning hours** – contact CabriniNA12@cox.net if you would like to participate and for more information. If we get enough interest, Cabrini NA will pay for advertisements in the local papers.


City of Tucson Environmental Services Department -- Trash and Recycling Notes --

- Environmental Services is offering a **Recycling Rewards** program. If your recycling container is in good order with properly sorted recycling items you may be given a special reward. If your bin is not in proper order you may be given a note indicating what needs to be changed.
- Environmental Services will repair or replace containers damaged as a result of normal wear and tear.
- Containers must be pulled back from the curb on non-collection days.
- Only trash and recycling placed in respective containers and placed on the curb will be picked up. Items placed outside of containers will not be picked up.
- Additional waste services can be requested as needed.
