The Enchanted hills Neighborhood Association is partnering with the Hank Oyama Elementary School to work on a federally funded project call Safe Sidewalks. This is a long term project that will provide a walking path on the southern side of w. 36th street, from the school eastward to Mission St. This will provide sidewalk for the students coming from the two apartment complexes on 36th, and the two nearest w.36th on Mission (north and south). There will be a public option for input during the initial process. You will have input on how you'd like the path to look.
