





The Cabrini Mural Project The wall on Presidio across from the church has been a magnet for graffiti and taggers for years. The property owners graciously have allowed for us to bring in an artist and paint a mural. Not only do we get something beautiful, we hope it will prevent further vandalism.

Cabrini Clean and Beautiful

Please remember it's a constant and we ALL have to participate. Just cleaning up after your dog, picking up some litter, pulling your bins back from the curb are all small things that make such a big difference.

Keeping things looking good benefits all of us. It sends out a signal that we care and won't tolerate vandalism or crime. Junk, trash and excessive storage invite rodents, vermin and can be fire hazards. Weeds aren't just unsightly, they cause allergens and can harbor mosquitoes which can harbor the deadly West Nile Virus. Graffiti and taggers mar surfaces that can be expensive or near impossible to clean up all while inviting more graffiti, tagging and gang activity.

Tucson has codes and regulations regarding most of these problems and they're so easy to contact (anonymously if you prefer!) to report violations.

Don't expect other people to report violations! It only takes a few moments of your time and we ALL benefit!

The Beautification Project This is one you'll be seeing through this next year. We applied for and were given a grant for beautification of our neighborhood. We'll be using this to dress up the roundabouts on Monte Vista and for planting vegetation throughout our neighborhood using water harvesting techniques.

Graffiti Wipe-Out! The Cabrini steering committee tries to take an active role in removing graffiti and we did quite a bit of that last year on our own.

In July, we hosted a major Graffiti Wipe-Out event which included Mayor Rothschild and approximately 100 volunteers! It was covered on two of our news stations and included us and four other neighborhoods.



Free Dog Obedience Event
We're putting on our first dog obedience training event of three sessions this fall. It may be the only time we do this or we might do this annually.

Streetlights Our neighborhood was not immune to copper thieves and we wound up without a single functioning streetlight! We got in touch with the city of Tucson, had them prioritize us, repair them and they've had tamper-resistant boxes installed to prevent further theft. An added bonus to this is we're being considered for implementation of solar powered street lights!



Dumpsters Neighborhoods are entitled to regularly scheduled dumpsters from the City of Tucson for their resident's use.

We're making sure to take full advantage of this and are regularly bringing them in now.
