### **ALL SOULS PROCESSION – TRAVEL INFORMATION**

Downtown will be the host of the 27<sup>th</sup> annual All Souls Procession on Sunday, November 6, 2016. The Procession will stage at Sixth Avenue and Seventh Street beginning Sunday at 4 p.m. The procession will begin moving through downtown at approximately 6 p.m. on Sunday. The Procession begins at the Sixth Avenue Underpass and heads south to Alameda Street. The procession will head west on Alameda Street to Granada Avenue and turns south to Congress Street. At Congress Street the procession turns west, passes under Interstate 10 and ends at the grand finale site at Congress Street and Linda Avenue near the Mercado San Agustin. It is anticipated that large crowds will attend the procession this year, so please arrive early. There are over 15,000 available parking spaces in Downtown Tucson. Many Downtown streets will be closed prior to the start of the All Souls Procession. Below are the vehicular travel restrictions associated with this event:

**All Souls Procession** – On Sunday, November 6, 2016, from approximately 2 p.m. until midnight, Sixth Avenue and Arizona Avenue will be closed from Sixth Street to Seventh Street, and Fifth Avenue from Sixth Street to Eighth Street. Additionally, Seventh Street will be closed from Ferro Avenue to Fourth Avenue.

From 4 p.m. to approximately 10 p.m., the following road closures will be in place:

Stone Avenue – Sixth Street to Franklin Street  
Toole Avenue – Stone Avenue to Sixth Avenue  
Church Avenue – Franklin Street to Pennington Street  
Sixth Avenue – Pennington Street to Congress Street  
Granada Avenue – Paseo Redondo to Broadway  
Alameda Street – Sixth Avenue to Manning House Way  
Congress Street – Stone Avenue to Church Avenue

There will also be a short term closure of both eastbound and westbound I-10 Frontage roads between St Mary's Road and 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, as well as the Congress Street off ramps while the procession is passing underneath I-10. Motorists driving in the downtown area may experience traffic delays associated with this event, so please plan accordingly. The traveling public should use caution when driving, bicycling or walking in this area. Please watch for event participants, obey all traffic control, and watch for detour signs and personnel providing traffic control.
