JOIN THE CITY OF TUCSON ON FEB. 13 FOR THE TUCSON DELIVERS SAFER CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

The Tucson Delivers program continues purchasing equipment, vehicles, and updating facilities for the Tucson Fire Department and the Tucson Police Department.

This event will focus on new paramedic ambulance units that will be in service shortly, and give you the chance to see Fire Station #9 before it undergoes a complete rebuild.

In May 2017, Tucson voters approved Proposition 101 (Tucson Delivers), a five-year, half-cent sales tax to fund improvements for streets and public safety. Sixty percent of the tax revenues are apportioned for public safety and 40 percent for street improvements.

Funds from Tucson Delivers can be spent only on items that were approved by voters. Two separate citizens' commissions, the Bond Oversight Commission and the Public Safety Tax Oversight Commission, provide oversight of Tucson Delivers sales tax collection and expenditures.
