Our 15-point curriculum, designed by Vimala McClure, author of *Infant Massage, A Handbook for Loving Parents*, will give you the knowledge base, experience and confidence you will need to fulfill your role as an instructor.

You will get practical experience teaching infant massage through the three-day parent-baby class that is part of each training.

As a Certified Educator of Infant Massage (CEIM), you will be able to work with parents and families in private, group, hospital and agency settings. In addition to private teaching, you will be able to participate in research studies, conduct in-service programs, and present at professional conferences.

Massage Therapists, Nurses, midwives, childbirth educators, early intervention specialists, NICU staff, OTs, PTs, parents and caregivers, and anyone interested in promoting nurturing touch as a parenting tradition have found this training to be a wonderful tool in their work with parents and babies.

This course and certification qualifies for 52-56 CE credit hours for nurses and massage therapists, and is also accredited through AOTA and Maryland Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, and counts as credit toward Infant Mental Health Certifications.

As an Infant Massage Parent Educator, you will have a rewarding opportunity to enhance parent-infant bonding, improve and maintain the physical well-being of babies, and facilitate long-term, positive emotional development.

Completing Your Certification

To earn your CEIM certifications you will need to:

- 1) Attend the in-depth four day certifications training, from 9-5 each day.
- 2) Complete a take-home, open book exam that includes teaching five parents to massage their babies in a five-week course, in your own community, in the months following the training.
- 3) Return your completed exam/practicum to your trainer for certification.

Infant Massage USA® training tuition is \$650, includes the four-day training, all your infant massage reading materials, your certification process and a year's membership in **Infant Massage USA®**

There is a \$25 discount if you register two weeks or more in advance (February 6).

Additional costs: CEUs - \$15 fee on day 4 of the training payable to 'Infant Massage USA' for those applying for continuing education credits. Snacks are provided. Lunch is on your own. You will need a doll on which to learn and teach the strokes. You will need to read a book on child development - often available through local libraries.
