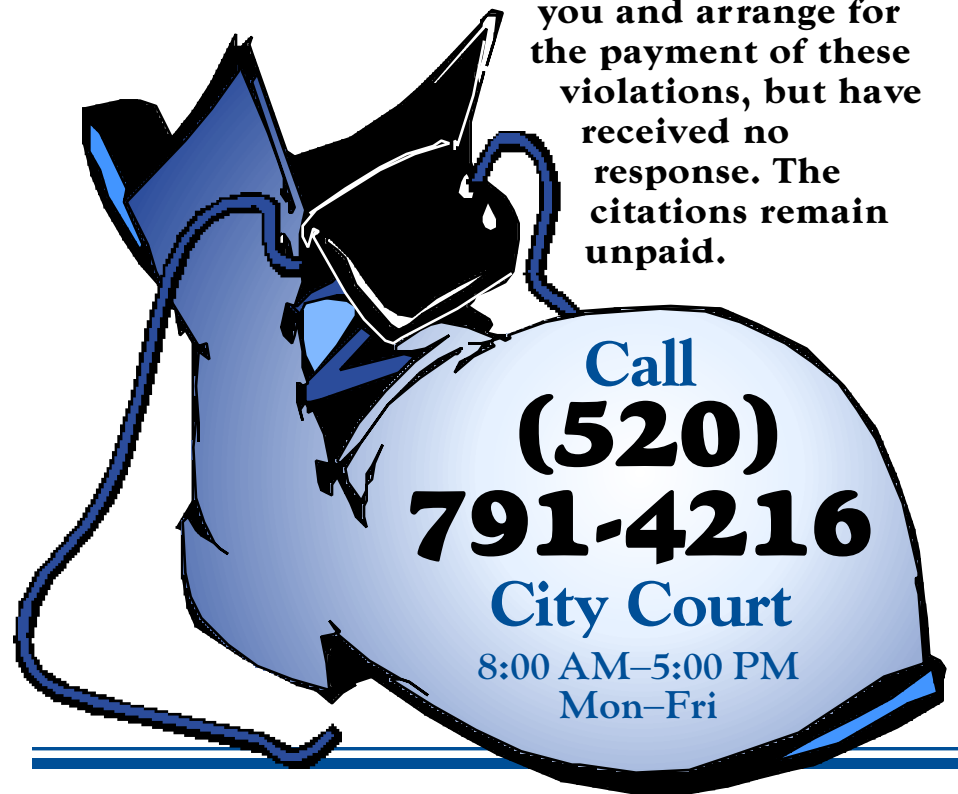
Collection fees and booting fees are added to the fines and fees for the citations that are in default.

WHAT'S THIS On My Vehicle & Why Was It Put There?

**Your vehicle has been "booted."
Please do not attempt to move the vehicle or severe damage may occur.**

The vehicle has been booted because the owner has more than three outstanding parking citations. We have made every effort to contact

you and arrange for the payment of these violations, but have received no response. The citations remain unpaid.





When Will the Boot Be Removed?

The boot will be removed by the end of the business day (Mon-Fri) when fees and fines due are paid prior to 4:30 P.M. Payments received about that time will result in the boot being removed the next business day between 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M. Boots will not be removed before 8:00 A.M., after 5:00 P.M., or on weekends.

There is a \$400.00 charge for damaged or stolen boots, in addition to other fines and fees due.

What If I Don't Call City Court?

If the vehicle is still booted 48 hours after the boot was installed, it will be towed from this parking space by

The vehicle's owner is responsible for any towing charges. They are payable directly to **Gary's Towing**.

A state-issued identification, a receipt from City Court, and a current vehicle registration or vehicle title will be needed to retrieve a vehicle from **Gary's Towing** after fees and fines due have been paid. If the person picking up the vehicle is not the owner, they must also have a notarized authorization from the vehicle owner to redeem the vehicle.

Do I Have To/ Can I Go To Court?

A court appearance is not necessary if the vehicle owner simply wants to pay the fines and fees due and have the boot removed. If the owner wants a court hearing, they should appear at City Court, 103 E. Alameda, on the date and time listed on the sticker that has been placed on the windshield of the vehicle. This hearing is only to determine whether the vehicle driver owned the vehicle at the time the original citations were issued. If, after this hearing, the case is continued, another hearing date will be set for within 30 days.

If the owner wants the vehicle released during the time interval prior to a court appearance, all fines and fees due must be paid. Some of these monies may be refunded based on the results of the second court hearing. However, certain fees will apply in any case, and not be waived regardless of the outcome of the second hearing.
