Refund Policy

The City of Tucson Parks and Recreation Department:

- reserves the right to cancel classes and KIDCO sites due to insufficient registrants or other causes beyond our control. In the event cancellation occurs, a full refund will be granted.
- requires a 24 hour notice for a refund of all qualified fees.
- requires withdrawals to be processed through Registration Services the first business day after online registration.
- reserves the right to change class instructors and KIDCO staff.
- A processing fee of 10% may be withheld.

Leisure Classes:

Withdrawals after class/session begins will be pro-rated based on the date Registration Services (791-4877) is notified. Refunds will not be granted once half of the class/session has been completed. Supply, lab and model fees are nonrefundable.

KIDCO:

Withdrawals from a program site on or before the 15th of the current month participant is in, will be issued a pro-rated refund for that month **based on the date Registration Services (791-4877) is notified.** Withdrawals after the 15th of the current month participant is in, will not be granted a refund for that month. Pre-paid months will be refunded.

DISCOUNT PROGRAM for City Residents Only

Parks and Recreation offers a Discount Program that enables low-income residents to pay a 50% discounted fee on selected programs and 25% for selected passes.

- 50% discount applies only to Schoolzout, KIDCO, KIDCO Inclusion, In-Betweeners's Club, Junior Staff in Training, Therapeutic Recreation and Swim Lessons.
- 25% discount applies only to Center quarterly/annual passes, Swim annual pass and Senior Activity Card.
- You can apply at any Parks and Recreation office or Center. Call Registration Services at 791-4877 for more details.

To qualify for the DISCOUNT PROGRAM, **All of the following conditions must be met:**

Must be a City of Tucson resident:

ELIGIBILITY VERIFICATION

Applicants must provide TWO forms of documentation proving City of Tucson Residency

Note: Discounts expire one year from date of approved application.:

1. APPLICANT IDENTIFICATION VERIFICATION:

Applicants must provide a picture ID with the same name that appears on the application. Acceptable forms may include:

- Driver License/non-driver ID card with photo
- Government issued ID card – passport, military, or tribal ID
- SunGo Card with photo
- Debit/Credit Card with photo

2. CITY OF TUCSON RESIDENT VERIFICATION:

Applicants must provide current documentation proving City of Tucson residency. Documentation should be dated within last 60 days. This must match the address provided for the application. PO Box is not acceptable for address. Name on this documentation must match ID.

Documentation may include:

- Utility bill (electric, gas, water, land line phone, cable)
- Mortgage Statement/Rental lease agreement
- Military base housing letter

3. HOUSEHOLD SIZE VERIFICATION. Applicants must provide proof of the number of people residing in the household. Proof may include any combination of documents that has the names and/or number of people.

This may include:

- Previous years income tax return with W2 forms
- Insurance card/Immunization record
- Birth Certificate
- Report card/school ID/school lunch program letter
- D.E.S. Award Letter

4. INCOME VERIFICATION. Applicants must provide current/valid proof of household income, including all household members' income sources (wages, public assistance, retirement, disability, pension, veteran's compensation, worker's or unemployment compensation, child support, alimony, senior benefits, survivor benefits, etc) Acceptable proof may include:

- Previous year's income tax return with W2 forms
- Environmental Services or Water award letter (automatic qualifier)
- SunTran Transit ID with economy pass designation (E, S, D) (automatic qualifier)
- Paystub dated within last 30 days
- Unemployment check stub within last 30 days
- D.E.S. award letter – food stamps, cash assistance
- Social Security/Disability letter
- School meal program letter

KIDCO PROGRAM COSTS AND PAYMENT PLAN

- Resident without discount: \$500
- Resident with discount: \$250
- Non-Resident: \$625

Two payment plan options available:

1. Full payment at time of registration.
- or
2. Payment Plan Available: (card automatically charged)

PAYMENT EXAMPLES FOR KIDCO PROGRAM

10% of registration total is due upon registration and scheduled payments of 10% of total are then due on the 15th of each month beginning on Aug. 15.

Cost breakdown per month:

- Resident without discount: \$50
- Resident with discount: \$25
- Non-City Resident: \$62.50 (no discount applies)

The credit/debit card used at time of registration will be automatically charged for each additional payment on the 15th of each month.

- If your card is declined due to insufficient funds, an attempt will be made to contact you for a different payment method. You may resubmit your card or use a different card number. You may make up to two cash payments per school year and one per summer.
- If we are unable to collect payment, your child(ren) will be withdrawn from the KIDCO program.
- If space allows, you can re-register, however, a re-registration fee of \$28.00 for the declined credit/debit card transaction will be charged.

YEAR-ROUND SCHOOLS- KIDCO PAYMENT PLAN

Cost for year-round program \$500 resident/\$625 non-resident. Scheduled payments: 15th of each month for the school-year.



Mission Manor



CITY OF TUCSON PARKS AND RECREATION SYSTEM MASTER PLAN

This fall, the City of Tucson Parks and Recreation Department kicked off a series of Stakeholder Focus Group Meetings, Open Houses and events to gather input on the future of Tucson's parks. We held nine stakeholder focus group meetings and six community-wide open houses, gathering hundreds of comments. A randomized community-wide survey is also being conducted to help supplement our in-person and email outreach.

The presentation from the first round of open houses is posted on the project website. Your comments are being compiled and combined with community data to help inform the City's Parks and Recreation Master Plan Needs Assessment. Stay tuned for its release in the new year.

Our community outreach efforts will continue early in 2016, with six additional community-wide open houses. At these meetings we will be presenting our initial assessment and analysis results.
