PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS AUTISM-FRIENDLY PARK IN DOWNTOWN TUCSON

Intermountain Centers and Tucson Parks and Recreation invite the public to participate in a discussion regarding the new autism-friendly park to be located downtown, adjacent to Intermountain's new Integrated Care Center for Children, 401 N. Bonita Ave.

The proposed park's [features](#) include a separate sensory play space for younger kids (ages 2-5) and older kids (ages 5-12), as well as five themed zones that have sensory playscapes and equipment. It will also have features for children with physical disabilities and plenty of shade sails and trees.

At this meeting, general information about the proposed park facilities will be available and the public will be encouraged to provide their thoughts, ideas, and vision for the park. Development of this new park is a multi-phase project, and each piece will be completed as funding becomes available.
