Subject: Sign code revision

So happy you are working on sign code revision.

It recently came to my attention that a large billboard-like construction sign erected across the street from me during a huge remodel project was legal according to the sign code. I was informed by the city that a 32 sq. foot temporary sign, 10 feet off the ground, the same size allowable for a commercial sign on a major street, like Speedway, is allowable in a neighborhood. Not sure what temporary means, but even one day is too long.

Needless to say, this is a revision that needs to take place. No commercial entity should be allowed to have signage like that in a neighborhood. Realtors don't have that and don't need it. Please add this to your comments section, as I want to see this changed. I don't know how long it has been on the books and I have not noticed such an ugly intrusion before, but as I said, in researching it, it is allowable and obviously some people will be interested in a sign of this size. I have lived in my historic neighborhood for nearly 30 years and own property in other neighborhoods and do not believe that signage of this size is helping neighborhoods retain residents or attract them.
