FATAL PEDESTRIAN COLLISION (DELAYED) 200 BLOCK OF WEST GRANT ROAD

On November 10, 2022, just after 6:00 p.m., an on-duty Tucson Police Officer advised via police radio that they had just been involved in a collision with a pedestrian while driving their patrol vehicle. The collision occurred in the 200 block of W. Grant Road, near N. 11th Avenue. Immediately after the collision, the TPD Officer began rendering aid to the pedestrian and performed CPR until Tucson Fire Medics arrived. Upon arrival, TFD Medics transported the pedestrian to Banner University Medical Center with life-threatening injuries. Patrol officers from Operations Division West responded to assist and secured the collision scene. Detectives from the Traffic Investigations Unit and investigators with the Office of Professional Standards (OPS) responded to continue the investigation.

Through interviews conducted by officers and detectives – in conjunction with roadway evidence – detectives learned that the pedestrian was standing on the raised median on Grant Road. Witness statements indicated that the pedestrian stepped off the median southbound into the vehicular lanes of travel, during which time the TPD Officer was traveling eastbound on Grant Road. The patrol vehicle, a 2008 Ford Crown Victoria, struck the pedestrian with its front passenger side. The pedestrian was mid-block crossing and not in a crosswalk. It was determined that the driver was not impaired at the time of the collision. Detectives discovered that the pedestrian had narcotics and narcotic paraphernalia in her possession. The pedestrian remained in the hospital receiving care for her injuries as the investigation continued. The officer was not injured during the collision.

On the afternoon of November 15, 2022, the Tucson Police Department was notified that the pedestrian had passed away as a result of her injuries. The pedestrian was identified as 64-year-old **Pamela Lee Marshall**. Her family was notified of her passing. Detectives are continuing the investigation while the Office of Professional Standards conducts a separate administrative investigation in to the actions of department personnel. Additional details will be provided as they become available.
