On March 18, 2017, around 11:15 p.m., officers from Operations Division Midtown and members from the Tucson Fire Department responded to a report of a serious injury collision involving a pedestrian near 3525 E. Grant Rd. Upon arrival, they located two citizens performing CPR on an adult male pedestrian in the roadway. Paramedics immediately transported the male to Banner University Medical Center with life threatening injuries. However, shortly after arrival, the male succumbed to injuries and was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The driver of the vehicle fled the scene and remains outstanding.

Detectives from the Tucson Police Department Traffic Investigations Unit responded to the scene to continue the investigation. They were able to determine the pedestrian was crossing Grant Rd. from south to north in front of 3525 E.

Grant Rd. He was not in or near a crosswalk. The pedestrian reached the curb lane for westbound travel when he was struck by an unknown westbound vehicle that fled the scene. Approximately a half a block west a small dog was also stuck, possibly by the same vehicle.

The investigation is ongoing and detectives are asking anyone with information related to this incident to please call 88-CRIME. You can remain anonymous.

The pedestrian has been identified as 74-year-old Conrad Alfonso Iacono II. Next of kin have been notified.
