HOME INVASION ARRESTS 6200 BLOCK SOUTH CAMPBELL AVENUE

On the late morning of April 10, 2013, Officers from Operations Division South responded to a report of a residential robbery that occurred at an apartment, which is located in the 6200 block of South Campbell Avenue. Upon their arrival, they found an adult female victim inside the home. Thankfully, the female was not injured. As the officers were speaking with her, they learned that two unknown males, one armed with a handgun, had entered her residence without her permission. The males bound the female victim and ransacked the home, taking various items before leaving in an unknown direction. The responding officers were able to obtain information regarding the possible whereabouts of the suspects after following some leads that directed them to a motel in the area of the 800 block of East Benson Highway. The officers located two males in the parking lot of the motel and quickly discovered that one of the males had victim's property in his possession. Further investigation led the officers to a specific room at the motel where two additional adult males were detained and additional property that had been stolen from the victim was seen in plain sight.

Detectives assigned to the Home Invasion Unit responded to assist with the investigation. A search warrant was obtained for the suspects' motel room along with a blue Mercury station wagon that was located on the property and associated to the suspects. Nearly all the property stolen from the victim was located in the room along with various firearms, narcotics, and narcotics paraphernalia. During the course of the investigation, the detectives determined that Alec Diaz-DeLeon (22-years old) was the armed individual who entered the victim's residence. Dillon Weber (21-years old) was the second individual, who entered the victim's residence and bound her. Andrew Valenzuela (26-years old) drove the two others to the victim location with knowledge that they were going to commit a robbery or burglary. Adrian Bradford (29-years old) accepted some of the victim's property as payment for a debt, knowing that it had just been taken in a residential robbery.

Mr. Diaz-DeLeon and Mr. Weber were each arrested for 1 count of Armed Robbery, 1 count of Conspiracy to Commit Armed Robbery, 1 count of Aggravated Robbery, and 1 count of Kidnapping, all felony offenses. Mr. Valenzuela was arrested for 1 count of Conspiracy to Commit Armed Robbery and Trafficking in Stolen Property, both felony offenses. Mr. Bradford was arrested for 1 count of Trafficking in Stolen Property, also a felony offense. All four were transported and booked into the Pima County Jail. Their booking photographs are attached below.
