### DOUBLE HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION

The Tucson Police Department is investigating a homicide in the 1300 block of North Bonanza Avenue. On September 2, 2014, just after 1:30 A.M., officers responded to the area after receiving several 911 calls of multiple gunshots heard.

As officers arrived to the scene, the Tucson Police Department Air Unit directed officers to a residence where the shooting had possibly taken place. When officers entered the front yard of the residence they located an adult female with obvious signs of gunshot trauma. She was pronounced deceased on scene. Officers then located an infant male near the adult female. The infant also had obvious signs of gunshot trauma and was pronounced deceased at the scene. As officers continued their investigation they located two dogs on the property that had been shot and killed. As they got to the front of the residence, officers located an adult male with obvious signs of gunshot trauma. He was also pronounced deceased.

Investigators from the Tucson Police Department's Night Detective Unit and Homicide Unit responded to the scene to continue the investigation. Detectives are still in the early stages of the investigation, but were able to determine that the adult male and female were residing in the home together with their infant child. Based on information received and evidence located at the scene, it appears that the gunshot wound to the adult male was self-inflicted. The case is currently being investigated as a double murder / suicide.

The adult female has been identified as 34 year-old Heather Marcucci.  
The infant child has been identified as 7 week-old Jase David DeBaker.  
The adult male has been identified as 21 year-old Jeremy DeBaker.  
Next of kin have been notified.

The Tucson Police Department is encouraging anyone with information about this incident to please call 911 or 88-CRIME.
