ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY BANK ROBBERY ATTEMPT AT 4669 EAST BROADWAY

*****UPDATE – APRIL 17, 2012*****

The suspect, **Allen Blaine Klundt (46-years-old)**, who attempted to rob the Wells Fargo Bank located at 4669 East Broadway on the afternoon of March 28, 2012 was located and apprehended on April 11, 2012. Information was received that Mr. Klundt was at a location in the Tucson area. The information proved to be accurate. Mr. Klundt was charged with **1 count of Attempted Robbery (Felony offense)** and booked into the Pima County Jail.

At approximately 5:44 p.m. on March 28, 2012, the Tucson Police Department was notified of a bank robbery that was occurring at the **Wells Fargo Bank located at 4669 East Broadway**. Officers from Operations Division Midtown responded to the bank, arriving within 4 minutes of their initial dispatch. Upon arrival, the officers quickly ascertained that no one had been injured during the incident and that the suspect had left prior to police arrival.

Detectives from the Robbery Unit responded to the bank to further the investigation. They collected evidence as well as interviewed both the victim teller and other witnesses in the bank. The initial investigation revealed that an adult male (described as a **40 to 50 year old Caucasian male, 6'00" to 6'02" tall, weighing 180 to 200 lbs**) entered the bank and approached the teller counter. The male presented the teller with a note demanding money and threatening harm. The teller did not give the suspect any money. Ultimately, the male left the bank empty-handed and was last seen walking away from the bank. He was wearing a **tan baseball hat, dark sunglasses, a long-sleeved blue and white striped polo-type shirt, and light colored blue jeans**.

The Tucson Police Department asks that anyone having information about this incident or having knowledge of the suspect's identity or whereabouts to call **911 or 88-Crime**. A photograph, which was captured via surveillance video, of the suspect is attached below.
