ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY SERIAL ROBBERY SUSPECTS /JUNE 2012

The Tucson Police Department seeks public assistance with identifying two males, who are suspects in multiple robbery incidents that have occurred between June 3, 2012 and June 18, 2012. There have been a total of six incidents thus far. On three of the occasions, both suspects entered the store together. The first suspect forced the clerk to get on the floor and either removed money from an open cash register or took the entire register from the store. While the first suspect was doing this, the second suspect kept his face covered and watched the front door. In the other three incidents, the first suspect entered alone. The males have been involved in robberies at the following locations:

- Subway restaurant located at 7245 East Tanque Verde on June 3, 2012 at 9:55 p.m.
- Subway restaurant located at 7865 East Broadway on June 5, 2012 at 11:33 p.m.
- Subway restaurant located at 3827 East Broadway on June 7, 2012 at 10:35 p.m.
- Avenue Boutique store located at 3050 East Broadway on June 9, 2012 at 4:58 p.m.
- 7/11 convenience store located at 1080 North Columbus on June 10, 2012 at 5:20 a.m.
- Sea of Green store located at 7995 East Broadway on June 18, 2012 at 3:23 p.m.

The first suspect is described as an **African-American male, 40 to 50 years of age, 6'0" to 6'2" tall, weighing 220 pounds, with no hair.** He has **worn a tan work boot or military style boot** on each occasion. He has **missing and rotting teeth.** The second suspect is described as a **Hispanic male, 5'6" tall, weighing 170 pounds.** Photographs of the first suspect, which were obtained from video surveillance footage from one of the incidents, are included below. No video surveillance images of the second suspect are available.
