



Circuit Map and Explanation from "Booklet No. 4"

One of the most important functions of the AQRA must be the establishing of carefully integrated "circuits" by cooperation between its member tracks. Already there exists a Texas-New Mexico circuit starting at Raton and taking in Albuquerque, El Paso and Eagle Pass. In Nevada-California a circuit is being established including Reno, Salinas, King City and Corona. Top horses from both these circuits will meet at Tucson for the World's Championship Quarter Horse Speed Trials.




As can be readily seen by a glance at the map on the preceding page, Tucson is geographically located at the center of interest in Quarter Racing. It is, therefore, the logical meeting place for the top horses from all over the Southwest and the dates of the World's Championship Quarter Horse Speed Trials are set to so coincide with the recognized circuits that it is possible for the champions from both East and West to take part. The horse that can win the Championship Stake at Tucson has gone far towards establishing his or her right to be known as "World's Champion."
