ORDINANCE NO. 12258

RELATING TO PARKS AND RECREATION; AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING CERTAIN NEW AND ADJUSTED PARK AND RECREATION FEES, AND AMENDING THE TUCSON CODE, CHAPTER 21-15; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF JULY 1, 2026.

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2026, Mayor and Council approved a Notice of Intent (NOI) to increase, introduce or modify TPRD fees; and

WHEREAS, TPRD also conducted extensive outreach with the Department of Transportation and Mobility (DTM), Tucson Water (TW), and Environmental Services (ES) including five in-person town hall meetings, in wards 1 through 5, and one virtual town hall meeting, along with the availability to provide online comments for those unable to attend these meetings; and

WHEREAS, at the Study Session on May 19, 2026, TPRD discussed with Mayor and Council feedback on certain fees and adjustments to proposed fees in response to input collected through the different engagement sessions with Mayor and Council; and

WHEREAS, TPRD is proposing revisions to existing and adoption of new fees charged by the Tucson Parks and Recreation Department (TPRD), including a new discount program, and proposing an amendment to Tucson Code Chapter 21-15 regarding non-city resident rates;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUCSON, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:


SECTION 1. The Mayor and Council adopt and approve the new and revised fees as set forth in Exhibit A to this Ordinance, "TPRD Proposed Fee Changes." The approved fees become effective on July 1, 2026.

SECTION 2. The Tucson Code, Chapter 21-15 is hereby amended as provided in Exhibit B to this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The various City officers and employees are hereby authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Ordinance.


SECTION 4. This Ordinance becomes effective on July 1, 2026 after it is adopted by Mayor and Council and is available from the City Clerk.

The following fees are set at a fixed rate effective July 1, 2026 unless noted in the specified column for a different start date. Where indicated a graduated fee is reflected to the corresponding year. The non-resident rate, should the change to code take effect, would result with non-residents paying 50% more than residents, and would adjust along with the resident rate progression. Proposed Amendments to Tucson Code Chapter 21

**ARTICLE I.
OPERATION AND REGULATION OF PARKS**

Sec. 21-15. Non-city resident rates.

Program and service fees and charges for non-city residents shall be established by the director. Rates shall not exceed the direct cost of the program or service plus fifty (50) percent for administrative overhead. Each fiscal year the director of parks and recreation shall publish a schedule of fees and charges for programs and services defining the non-city resident rate structure.
