Vice-Mayor Dunbar MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ronstadt to pass and adopt Ordinance No. 10173 as recommended by the Citizen Sign Code Commission.

Council Member West MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ibarra to offer a substitute motion to require that additional fines and revised fees shall be used to enable effective enforcement of the City's sign code, that the amended Ordinance goes into effect for one year and will continue after that only if the ordinance has raised sufficient revenues to effectively enforce the sign code. If sufficient revenue has been raised to effectively enforce the sign code then the amended ordinance would remain in effect. If not, the ordinance will sunset. In addition the City must immediately establish a measure to evaluate the effectiveness of the new enforcement activities of the City sign code.
