4. PUBLIC HEARING: RELATING TO THE ISSUE OF A LIVING WAGE – MAY24-99-243 (CONTINUED)

Council Member Anderson MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Leal, that staff:

- 1. Contact the following five cities for living wage ordinance information Baltimore, San Jose, Minneapolis, Los Angeles and Milwaukee.
- 2. Contact the remaining 39 businesses that might have a contract with the City to see whether (a) they offer health benefits (b) what the compression effects will be on the salaries of other employees if an \$8 living wage is implemented, and (c) if there are any special circumstances that might warrant an exemption.
- 3. Research cost of City of Tucson implementing an \$8 living wage for City employees.
- 4. Return to the Fiscal and Human Resources Subcommittee within 45 days with results of the research and return to Mayor and Council on August 2, 1999 with a draft ordinance.

Council Member Leal amended the motion that:

- 1. Staff be free to choose any city to contact regarding the living wage issue.
- 2. In addition to contacting companies that offer health benefits, find out from those companies who do not offer health benefits the impact offering health benefits would have.

Amendment acceptable to the maker.

Motion, as amended, <u>PASSED</u> by a vote of 4 to 2 (Council Members Ronstadt and Scott dissenting, Mayor Miller absent/excused).
