# 4. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT: SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS NOV18-02-693

City Manager, James Keene, announced:

- a. As part of the "100 Little Things for Downtown", the Heart of the City Award was presented to Richard Oseran at the Grand Opening of the Rio Nuevo Office.
- b. The Department of Transportation has received two federal grants: \$207,000 for the Historic Trolley and \$397,000 for a museum at the Historic Depot.
- c. Staff from the Department of Transportation completed another Down and Dirty on Saturday last weekend.
- d. A letter of gratitude from a developer noting the tremendous leadership of Development Services' Ernie Duarte.
- e. The "Oscar's" of Government the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Innovation in Government has named two City of Tucson programs, the City Court Mental Health Unit and Foundations for Leadership as finalists for awards. The list has been narrowed to 1,000 across the country and there are only five finalists in Arizona.
- f. The SABER Program has been selected to be showcased at the Neighborhoods USA 2003 Conference.
- g. Youth and Family Services of the Department of Neighborhood Resources has received a technical NLC grant.
- h. Jean Ann Fisher has been elected as the First Woman President of the Arizona Transit Association.
