City Manager Mike Hein announced:

- a. Tucson has been selected as one of the top 10 digital cities in the Digital Cities Survey sponsored by the Center for Digital Government. Tucson tied for 4<sup>th</sup> place in the category of 250,000 or more population and has been in the top 10 for all five years in which this survey has been conducted.
- b. On November 18<sup>th</sup>, the Arizona State Transportation Board met and approved the Transportation Enhancement Review Committee's recommendations for funding for the 13<sup>th</sup> round of Transportation Enhancement Funds. The City of Tucson was awarded \$493,000 for the Campbell Avenue Main Street Project. These funds will be complemented by \$330,000 issued by the Federal Government for the 2005 Omnibus Appropriations Bill.
