The date for pulling permits must be modified to March 30, 2005 Amends Section 3 of Ordinance 10073 for: subsection A.3

Amending Section 5 to the ordinance to state: "This ordinance becomes effective on January 1, 2005

Adding a new Section 6 to the ordinance to state: "Sections 1 and 2 of Ordinance 9781 providing for a special exception procedure or development within the Davis Monthan Airport Environs Zone remains in effect until the effective date of this ordinance.

Amending 2.8.5.7(f) by adding a new sentence to the end of the paragraph "Nothing herein shall require any notice be provided by property owners that would be in addition to the requirements provided by state law."

3. Council directs staff to work with the construction community to further refine the draft sound attenuation development standards for warehouse, industrial, and commercial development specifically related to Section E, Roofs, and Section G, Ventilation.
