The Alarm Advisory Task Force meets on alternating Saturdays at the Chamber Office, 465 W. St. Mary's at 10:00 a.m.
- Associate Presiding Magistrate, Antonio Riojas, will be presenting to 2000 attendees at a Court Technology Conference in Kansas City, Missouri.
- The Department of Transportation is featured in a Channel 12

- d. There was a great party last Friday celebrating the storefronts and Icehouse Lofts "Living in Tucson Just Got Cooler at the Icehouse Lofts".
- e. International Association Chiefs of Police recognized Tucson Police Department's "Coplink" for being one of seven finalists for an award recognizing innovative projects in such areas as community policing crime prevention and state of the art technology.
