- d. Rachelle Barr also spoke about her disappointment with the decision to remove youth volunteers from the Tucson Convention Center on Thursday evening of the relief efforts. She felt that having teen involvement in future events could help connect the adult communities to the teen community.
- e. Nicole Munguia also spoke about her disappointment with the decision to remove youth volunteers from the Tucson Convention Center on Thursday evening of the relief effort. She also indicated that the teens did not even get a thank you for their efforts, but just told they were a risk and they needed to leave.

 - f. Anne Morales, a youth group leader, also expressed disappointment with the decision to remove youth volunteers from the Tucson Convention Center on Thursday evening of the relief efforts. She did not like the three excuses given to the teens: that the evacuees were dangerous, that the bedding could be HIV infected and that the loading dock was a fire hazard. She wondered why this was only considered a hazard to those under the age of 18. She also expressed her dislike that the teens were escorted out by armed police.
 - g. Beryl Kelley wanted to know why volunteers were turned down because of age, when in most other cases the community wants teens and children involved.
