Council Member Anderson MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ronstadt, that Mayor and Council pass and adopt Resolution No. 18396 with the following amendments:

- 1. change to policy # 1 on Page 22 so that it reads, "recognize the established P-1 Park Industrial Zone District located south of Ft. Lowell, between Richey and Palo Verde and allow expansion to the remainder of the block if appropriate design elements and buffering techniques are incorporated in the expansion to minimize impacts on adjacent residential uses encouraging the upgrading and sensitive development of this area".
- 2. change to policy # 2 on Page 23 so that it reads "prohibit zoning changes to allow new primary industrial uses on land that is currently zoned for residential, office or commercial uses except where allowed by the conceptual land use map".
- 3. Modify the conceptual land use map to reflect the two changes.

Council Member Ronstadt offered a friendly amendment to modify Page 21, policy #2, to add the following "support a special exception land use designation or if necessary consider rezoning of the site to commercial zoning to remove the non-conforming use status and to allow continued use of the site for "the gardens" and associated uses. Future application submittals should address the impacts of noise, hours of operation, and traffic impacts on adjacent residential uses. The following criteria should also be met".

Amendment acceptable to the maker.

Motion, as amended, PASSED by a vote of 7 to 0.

LAND USE CODE – RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON LARGE SCALE RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ("BIG BOX/SUPERSTORES") – SEPT27-99-503

ORDINANCE NO. 9293

Council Member Leal MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Scott, that Mayor and Council close the public hearing.

Motion <u>PASSED</u> by a vote of 7 to 0.

Council Member Leal MOVED, SECONDED by Vice-Mayor Marcus, the Mayor and Council pass and adopt Ordinance No. 9293 (Option 3) with the following changes:

- 1. that in combination of retail with food and beverage sales that general merchandise in retail sales shall not be combined with food and beverage sales except where one of the land use classes consists of less than ten percent (10%) of the gross floor area Section 3.5.9.7.A.13
- 2. changes to the Section 3.5.9.7.A. and 3.5.9.7.B. proposed by Mayor Miller as follows:
 - a. Grocery area limited to 10% maximum of enclosed area ADDRESSES traffic increase issue and impact on small strip malls.
 - b. **Buffers** REQUIRES a 200 foot setback from the neighboring residential use.
 - c. **Hazardous Materials Plan** REQUIRES management plan and inventory of materials per Tucson City Fire Code.
 - d. **Section A, No. 5 Outdoor storage area -** SCREENED so as not visible from public street. Screening should be at least eight feet high of masonry construction.
 - e. **Section A, No. 6 Trash collection area** NO TRASH may be removed between 4:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. during scheduled trash collection.
- 8. PUBLIC HEARING: TUCSON CODE AMENDING (CHAPTER 23) LAND USE CODE – RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON LARGE

SCALE RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ("BIG BOX/SUPERSTORES") – SEPT27-99-503 (CONTINUED)

- f. **Section A, No. 9 Noise abatement** NO IDLING TRUCKS from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- g. **Section A, No. 10 Traffic impacts** A TRAFFIC IMPACT ANALYSIS to be done by the applicant using the Institute of Transportation Engineers. The City's Transportation Department will direct the scope and criteria of the study.
- h. **Section A, No. 11 Outdoor lighting requirements** ADHERE to low-pressure sodium for any lighting between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- i. Section B, No. 6 Aesthetics:
 - 1. <u>Facades and Exterior Walls including sides and back</u> will mitigate any negative view from adjacent properties and/or streets.
 - 2. <u>Detail features</u> will contribute to visual interest at the pedestrian scale and reduce massive effect through wall offsets, color, texture, etc.
 - 3. <u>Roofs</u> will complement the architectural and visual character of adjoining neighborhoods.
 - 4. <u>Materials and color</u> compatible with adjoining neighborhoods. Colors are low reflective, subtle, neutral, etc.
 - 5. <u>Entryways</u> aesthetically pleasing with clearly defined customer entrances.
 - 6. <u>Screening and Mechanical Equipment</u> be screened to mitigate noise and views.
- 3. All approvals of large retail projects are by Type III Legislative Procedure Special Exception.
- 4. The grandfather clause for past rezonings, specific plans and development plans to extend only five years before the effective date of this ordinance.

Council Member Leal also requested this ordinance be brought back in one year for review.

8. PUBLIC HEARING: TUCSON CODE AMENDING (CHAPTER 23) LAND USE CODE – RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON LARGE

SCALE RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ("BIG BOX/SUPERSTORES") – SEPT27-99-503

City Attorney, Tom Berning, requested the following technical amendment at Section 3.5.9.7. on Page 8 – end the second sentence at the word "section" and strike the words, "if permitted by the applicable zone in the RVC & C-1 zones approval of a large scale retail establishment must be secured through a Type V administrative procedure."

All amendments acceptable to the maker and second.

Motion, as amended, <u>PASSED</u> by a vote of 5 to 2 (Council Members Ronstadt and Scott dissenting).

Council Member Leal MOVED, SECONDED by Vice-Mayor Marcus, that Mayor and Council appoint Ms. Kathleen Price to the Committee of Massage Examiners.
