4. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT: SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS SEPT8-03-482

City Manager, James Keene, announced:

- a. Phase 1 of the CAP water litigation has been concluded and checks have been issued and delivered to the claimants' attorney for dispersal, in accordance with the judgement entered by the Court.
- b. Second item is a report on the status of the alarm policy change from Tucson Police Department. After 3 days of implementation, transition is going better than expected.

1/3 of false alarm calls sent to TPD from alarm companies have been eliminated.

Response time on verified calls has been cut in half.

Only one alarm call in the first three days was a real burglary from a verified alarm and received a 5 minute response.

Prior to this policy, this response would have taken 30 minutes.

c. Tucson Fire's plans for September 11. All City of Tucson's fire stations will participate in a simple brief ceremony. At 6:58 a.m. all fire personnel will assemble with apparatus bay doors open; at 6:59 a.m. (time of the South Tower collapse) dispatch will open all microphones and sound 3 sets of 5 dispatch tones; at 7:00 a.m. one minute of complete silence; 7:01 a.m. dispatch will open all microphones to allow Chief Newburn to make a few remarks, followed by Tucson Fire Department Inspector Nicki Springer singing "God Bless America".

- d. Ted Downing presented the Mayor and Council with federal inspection reports on the Kinder-Morgan fuel pipelines in Tucson.
