Mayor Miller recommended that Mayor and Council give staff direction for the following:

- 1. The testing of water wells for contamination be done as soon as possible
- 2. Return to Mayor and Council with a report as soon as possible
- 3. If "x" amount of wells are too be closed down that staff immediately form a plan on conservation for the community
- 4.. The report include information on meeting the requirements of water in our home and fire suppression at the same time.

Council Member Marcus MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ronstadt, that Mayor and Council direct staff to do the following:

- 1. Water Department proceed expeditiously as possible so that Mayor and Council can have an accurate reading on all the production wells; once this information is obtained that wells be closed due to the standard 300 picuries close these wells;
- 2. Figure how we maintain fire suppression and water supply; and
- 3. Conservation be raised to a maximum level.

Council Member Ronstadt AMENDED the motion that the Regional EPA Official attend the Mayor and Council meeting that will be scheduled

Amendment acceptable to the maker.

Council Member Leal agreed with Council Member Ronstadt's suggestion in regards to extending an invitation to the EPA official, however a setting of a community forum at the Tucson Convention Center should be created.

Council Member Anderson Substituted the Motion, that Mayor and Council direct staff to return with complete information so that Mayor and Council can continue to discuss this, and to include both Council Members Ronstadt and Leal's friendly amendments, so that we can be allowed to completely explore this with staff, the community, and the scientific community from the University of Arizona, and make a rational decision and this point in time.

Motion DIED due to lack of a second.

Council Member Ronstadt added that a member of the National Academy of Sciences be present as well.

Motion as amended, PASSED by a vote of 6 to 1, (Council Member Anderson dissenting).
