4. Pay Day Lending Facilities (City-Wide) SS/AUG2-05-208

Vice Mayor Dunbar MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ronstadt to approve the City Manager's recommendation to engage in a three pronged approach to include 1) working with Pima County on their regulatory approach, 2) pursuing legislation, and 3) initiating development of a zoning regulation, such as separation between facilities and return by September 20th with an Ordinance specifically limiting pay day lenders proximity to each other.

Motion PASSED by a vote of 7 to 0.

Council Member Ibarra requested a detailed map with locations and an history of where this started in the legislature and how it expanded to where we are today. Additionally staff should work with Pima County and Southwest Center for Economic Integrity.

Council Member Leal also requested staff investigate the possibility of requiring a Special Use Exception Process.

Council Member West requested staff investigate the Sunset Date of 2010 and ensure that it remains, and reinforced the thought that the issue be part of our legislative agenda.
