 Discussion of Arizona House Bill 2022 "Agricultural Water, Best Management Practices" (City-Wide & Outside City) SS/FEB4-02-31

Council Member Leal MOVED, SECONDED by Vice Mayor West to approve the City Managers recommendation to:

- 1. Go on record as opposing House Bill 2022 in its current form.
- 2. Direct staff to seek amendments to House Bill 2022 as necessary to protect the City's interests. Such amendments may include:
 - Requiring a full evaluation of the agricultural Best Management Practices (BMP) program at the end of the Third Management Period (2010), and requiring that the program be terminated if participants in the program have increased their water usage under the BMP.
 - Revising other statutes as necessary to require ADWR to calculate progress toward safe yield on a sector-bysector basis in the Third, Fourth and Fifth Management Periods; and
- 3. Direct staff to seek a "substantive policy statement" from ADWR that explicitly states that ADWR will not require, directly or indirectly, any water-using sector (municipalities, specific industries, agriculture, etc.) to compensate for groundwater mining by any other water-using sector.

Additionally members of Mayor and Council are encouraged to make personal contact with member of the Committee to seek support.
