6. Implementation of the One & One Plus Recycling Program (City-Wide) SS/FEB25-02-52

Vice Mayor West MOVED, SECONDED by Council Member Ronstadt to authorize the expenditure of \$5.3 million from the Environmental Reserve Fund for implementation of the One and One Plus Recycling Program. This amount includes \$5.2 million for the purchase of 130,000 blue barrels, \$55,000 for the purchase of a second container delivery truck, and \$35,000 for the installation of hopper lids on recycling collection trucks.

Additionally, staff is directed to begin the education program now and there should be no interruption of recycling services with the program beginning July1, 2002.
