- 2. if the conceptual proposals are agreed upon and can be framed as a condition of rezoning document in a manner acceptable to the city, a modification to total closure of the streets may be revisited; and
- 3. the implementation of these conditions would be worked out in a public CDRC process. El Con must request a "Change of Conditions" on the existing rezoning and those "Changes of Conditions" would have to be adopted by Mayor and Council. That would make the conditions part of the zoning and enforceable by the City. A final development plan would then be prepared for approval.
