7. Mayor and Council Regional and National Committee Reports (City-Wide) - SS/MARCH18-08-75

Vice Mayor Trasoff reported on the NLC conference and stated that there is a contingent not only from southern Arizona but central as well that are hearing our needs in terms of the modern street car.

Council Member Scott reported that the House and Senate adopted budget resolutions, but these are non-biding. On March 12<sup>th</sup> at the House Committee on financial services the Hearing Commission Chair blasted the municipal bond insurers for acting on grievous misjudgment by exposing themselves to sub-prim mortgage risk that

has led to unfair excessive cost for issuers including local governments. At the federal level they are trying to stem the rise of foreclosures and allowing Federal Housing Administration to insure and guarantee refinanced mortgages. The House and Senate leaders are going to move quickly on legislation that would create a national infrastructure bank to help develop public/private investments for large transportation and water projects. In the House there are very important discussions in regard to immigration, such as, new legislation that would authorize more at the boarder, the hiring of 8,000 additional boarder agents, a mandatory verification system for employers and to issue more visas for summer workers.
