- This Committee will screen and rank all the applications received and forward all materials to Mayor and Council. The Human Resources Director will advise this committee and take all necessary steps to solicit applications for the position and submit them to the committee for its consideration.
- All appointments to the committee shall be made on or before June 5, 2000. The committee shall make its recommendations on or before August 7, 2000.
