TUCSON'S ELECTION PUBLICITY PAMPHLET IN HOMES AND ONLINE: The City of Tucson's "The Choice is Yours" election publicity pamphlet recently was mailed to eligible voters in the city and is also online in PDF format.

On Tuesday, Nov. 7, City of Tucson voters will choose a mayor, as well as council members from Wards 1, 2, and 4. They will also vote on Proposition 413, which asks voters whether they want to raise the salaries of Mayor and Council for the first time since 1999. The election is part of the consolidated general and

special election. Voters in five school districts will decide on bond and override elections, and there will be a Vail Incorporation Special Election.

HOMELESS ENCAMPMENT PROTOCOL & REPORTING TOOL: The Homeless Encampment Protocol is initiated when a homeless camp, located on City property or private property, poses a threat to public safety, causes a major criminal or health concern, or when there is camping in any City park after hours. The encampment online reporting tool will allow our community to help the City identify encampment locations and assess the level of response needed, including outreach, clean-up, and enforcement. To report an encampment online, go to: https://reportencampments.tucsonaz.gov/, or call the Resource Hotline (520) 791-2540.

NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION MEETINGS: Neighborhoods in Ward 5 are meeting again in person. Ward 5 has many neighborhood associations and with the pandemic, some stopped meeting or had virtual meetings. HIGH-EFFICIENCY CLOTHES WASHER AND TOILET REBATES AVAILABLE: Tucson Water customers can apply to get rebates when purchasing and installing qualifying high-efficiency toilets and/or clothes washers. Single-family rebates are \$100 for the purchase of a qualifying high-efficiency clothes washer or replacing your old front-loading machine with a new front-loading machine. Get a \$200 rebate if replacing your old top-loading machine with a new front-loading machine. Residential, multi-family, and commercial customers can also get a \$100 rebate when buying Premium High-Efficiency toilets. Qualifying low-income customers can purchase a discounted high-efficiency clothes washer for \$200. LOW-INCOME WATER CONSERVATION SERVICES: Qualifying Tucson Water customers can apply to receive grants and loans to install rainwater harvesting and gray water irrigation systems. In partnership with SERI (Sonoran Environmental Research Institute), participants can receive up to \$1,000 in grants and \$2,000 in zero-interest loans and SERI will cover the upfront cost of the project. Other programs include our discounted high-efficiency clothes washer where eligible customers can purchase a machine for only \$200 that can be paid with a zero-interest loan and our FREE toilet replacement services in partnership with Community Home Repair Projects of Arizona (CHRPA) where customers that are homeowners can receive up to 2 toilet replacements at no cost. RAINWATER HARVESTING (up to a \$2,000 rebate) & GRAY WATER (up to a \$1,000 rebate) - The Tucson Water Conservation Program offers rebates for installing rainwater harvesting and permanent gray water irrigation systems. Taking advantage of these opportunities in your home can help conserve water and save you money! A free, three-hour workshop and submission of a project plan are required to qualify. Check out the upcoming workshop dates and our Rainwater & Gray Water Pressurized System - Backflow Prevention Requirement informative video. Our partners offer different days, times, and modalities that can accommodate different schedules. Check them out! For more information, call (520) 791-3242.

NEW SUN TRAN SCHEDULES: The Sun Link streetcar is operating with extending route hours. Sun Link now runs until 2 a.m. on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. Sun Tran, Sun Express, and Sun Shuttle also have new schedules. HOW TO REPORT TRANSPORTATION CONCERNS: Is there a pothole you'd like to see filled after yesterday's storm? Is a street sign missing? Is a tree limb hanging too close over a roadway or sidewalk? You can report these issues to the City of Tucson's Department of Transportation and Mobility, (520) 791-3154, or email the exact location to <u>TDOTConcerns@tucsonaz.gov</u>.

FENTANYL: Fentanyl is a huge issue in our community. In the last two years, Arizona has seized over 50% of the fentanyl in the country. Pima County averages 25-30 fatal overdoses a month. It also has a huge impact on our crime rates, pedestrian fatalities, and quality of life issues.

The Counter Narcotics Alliance (CNA) has taken a collaborative proactive approach to the issues. One of the areas we have been pushing is awareness and providing information to the community, which can be found by scanning the QR code.


