

1. The Pima County Board of Supervisors voted to adopt the Pima County Regional Ten-Year Housing Strategy and Funding Plan (attached) on March 3. This is the culmination of a year of planning and development and gives us a clear roadmap to meet our goals. The plan includes:
  - 5 goals and 27 strategies
  - A \$413M funding plan with estimate of the need that can be or still needs to be met,
  - A Community Revitalization Plan for 10 areas of the County
  - Roles and responsibilities across the region
  - Metrics, reporting, and continued oversight by the Pima County Regional Affordable Housing Commission.
  
2. Community and Workforce Development (CWD) received a \$2M grant from the Garcia Family Foundation to fund a Homelessness Prevention HUB within our department. The HUB will provide staffing for a one-stop access point similar to our one-stop employment model. See memo attached.
  
3. 3. Community and Workforce Development has assisted 15 households and spent \$271,090 from the Keeping People Housed general fund allocation for Home Repair. \$50,000 each for Pascua Yaqui Tribe and Tohono O’odham Nation has been allocated for their respective Home Repair programs. CWD has served 620 unduplicated households with Rent/Mortgage/Utility assistance with \$1,453,950 in obligated funds from the Keeping People Housed general fund allocation.
