

Stacy Redondo Fields Naming Process – Public Feedback Briefing

Purpose

This briefing summarizes public feedback received through the proposal to name the softball fields at Kennedy Park. The intent is to provide a neutral, factual overview of participation levels, response distribution, and key themes expressed by respondents.

Participation Overview

- **Total comments received:** 182
- **Yes (support the name change):** 157 → **86.3%**
- **No (do not support the name change):** 25 → **13.7%**

Public feedback shows **strong overall support** for the naming change

Summary of Feedback Themes

Responses Supporting the Naming (Yes – 157 or 86.3%)

Primary Themes:

- **Honor and Recognition:** Many commenters expressed that Stacy Redondo is deserving of recognition for her contributions, legacy, and impact on the community.
- **Community Impact:** Supporters cited her role as a mentor, coach, educator, and positive influence on youth and families, particularly through sports.
- **Personal Connections:** A significant number of comments reflected personal relationships, shared experiences, or firsthand knowledge of her character, describing her as inspirational, compassionate, and dedicated.
- **Appropriateness of Tribute:** Commenters felt naming the ballfield was a meaningful and lasting way to honor her life and service.
- **No Objection to Renaming:** Several respondents stated they had no issue with changing the existing name and viewed the update as reasonable and respectful.

Representative sentiment:

“Well deserved,” “a fitting honor,” and “a meaningful way to recognize her impact on Tucson youth and sports.”

Responses Opposed to Renaming (No – 25 Or 13.7%)

Primary Themes:

- **Preference to Keep Existing Name:** Many opposed any name change, expressing a general desire to leave existing park and facility names unchanged.
- **Cost and Priorities:** Concerns were raised about public funds being used for renaming, signage, or administrative efforts, with comments suggesting resources should be spent elsewhere.
- **Process and Precedent:** Some commenters questioned the process or worried about setting a precedent for future renaming requests.
- **Respect Without Renaming:** A few acknowledged Stacy Redondo's accomplishments but felt recognition should occur in another form rather than changing the field's name.
- **Frustration with Government Actions:** Several comments reflected broader dissatisfaction with city decision-making rather than opposition specific to the individual being honored.

Representative sentiment:

“Leave things as they are,” “unnecessary change,” and “not a good use of resources.”

Key Takeaway

Public feedback shows **strong overall support** for the naming change, with opposition representing a smaller portion of responses and largely centered on concerns about renaming practices, costs, and process rather than objections to the individual being honored.
