Fines for Barricade Violations

Violation	Description	Civil Sanction
No. 1	Presenting an imminent risk of death or injury to the public within public right-of-way	\$1500.00
No. 2	Restricting roadway without proper certification or without a barricading permit for more than 30 minutes	\$1000.00
No. 3	Restricting traffic during peak hours without permission from the Director of Transportation	\$1000.00
No. 4	Failing to correct or cure violations within the time period stated in a warning notice	\$1000.00
No. 5	Restricting traffic at signalized intersections without active work occurring within 30 minutes of the restriction	\$1000.00
No. 6	Violating restriction limits or times and/or locations as contained in the barricading temporary use permit	\$500.00
No. 7	Leaving advance warning signs facing traffic more than 45 minutes after the restriction has been removed	\$250.00
No. 8	Leaving traffic control devices in the right-of-way for 24 hours after temporary barricading permit expires	\$250.00
No. 9	Failure to comply with the use of MUTCD and/or NCHRP 350 compliance devices	\$250.00

Temporary Work Zone Traffic Management Program

What are the Goals of the Program?

A Temporary Work Zone Traffic Management Program has been established to provide for:

- Work zone safety
- Better managed temporary roadway restrictions
- Minimized delays and frustrations for the traveling public
- Reduced impacts to local businesses
- Facilitating improvements in the right-of-way
- Increased barricade placement inspections

The Program is intended to enhance the planning, application, and oversight of traffic control management in temporary work areas in roadways, sidewalks and transit zones. As part of the program, a permit is required.

You Need a Permit If You Impact the Following:

- Travel lanes
- Alleys
- Median or Shoulder
- Sidewalks
- Driveways at the street connection
- Bike lanes
- Bus Stops

You Need a Traffic Control Plan if Your Project...

- Work lasts longer than 1 day
- Work on Arterial and Collector Roadways
- Major Impacts, such as closing 2 out of 3 lanes on a roadway (includes 1 day permits)
- All Road Closures (includes 1 day permits)

Process For Permit

1. Submit Application and Traffic Control Plan (if required)
 - Via Fax: (520) 791-5526
 - Via Email: barricade1@tucsonaz.gov
 - Via Walk-in: 201 N. Stone Ave. (Alameda & Stone), 5th Floor
 - Via Mail: P.O. Box 27210, Tucson, AZ, 85726-2710
2. Typically, permits will be reviewed within 5 working days
3. Permit Issued & Payment Received

Costs and Methods of Payment:

Fees For Permits

A **Permit Fee** of \$75.00 for every 30 days of estimated project completion time will be collected for each barricading permit. Projects with an estimated completion time beyond a multiple of 30 days, will be rounded to the next highest multiple of 30 days for permitting purposes.

A **Traffic Control Plan Review Fee** of \$50.00 will be collected in addition to the permit fee provided above.

Public Utilities may apply for a one-time annual payment of \$12,000.00 per year. Additional plan review fees may be required.

Permit fees and review plan fees provided above shall be doubled if the request for permit is submitted less than 72 hours (3 business days) in advance of the proposed commencement of the work. All fees are non-refundable.

Method of Payment

We accept cash, checks and Draw Down Accounts.
