- Traffic Engineering will only accept fully completed applications.
- A Traffic Control Plan must be submitted along with the application for a job that lasts more than one day on a City Street; and for any major impacts that occur on Collector and Arterial Roadways, including one day operations.
- The applicant certifies that the Traffic Control Devices and Plan are in conformance to Part VI of the Manual on Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as amended by the State of Arizona, Tucson's City Code 25, and any other standards set forth by the City Transportation Director.
- If your project extends beyond the permit's expiration date, you must renew it 24 hours before it expires. If you do not renew within 24 hours, another application will be required and a new permit number will be issued.
- If you close a road or alley, you must provide written notice 24 hours in advance to the following parties: Affected school districts, emergency services, businesses, residences, Ward offices, Environmental Services, postal service and the news media.
