I was sad to hear of the death of Ken Johnson, a veteran of both Korea and Vietnam who was a fixture at city council meetings. He would often testify at call to the audience to keep us all up to date on veterans' activities in the community.

I regret not knowing more about him and his service to our country. He was in the 101st Airborne Division, one of the more storied Army units of the last century. I don't know which of the many heroic missions of the 101st that he was involved in, but during his time, members of the 101st participated in the Korean Conflict, escorted students to Little Rock High School during this country's fight for equality and fought in the final engagement with the North Vietnamese Army.

There is a lot that I learned from him by watching his dedication to his fellow veterans and this country. Last year, the New York Times ran a story about Memorial Day services at Evergreen Cemetery, some-

thing he made sure to do every year. He continued doing this even though he required an oxygen tank and a wheelchair.

I'll miss seeing him at council meetings. Rest in Peace, Mr. Johnson.

HOUGHTON ROAD UPDATE

Broadway Intersection Improvements: Intersection work started November 4, 2013, and was originally anticipated to be substantially complete by the end of July 2014. (Actual contract ends in October, and the contractor is hopeful they can come in early.) The rains and waiting for the sewer approval have held us up, but we are moving forward as fast as we can. We still hope to be substantially complete the first part of August. Final wrap-up is expected in August 2014.

We don't have any additional shifts planned for this next week. We may work on Saturday to catch up for some lost rain time.

Water line work is completed

The new sewer installation is completed, and we finally received approval to bury the line and install the box culverts along Broadway in front of the Safeway shopping center. The boxes have been going in very quickly and the installation is about 90% complete.

Work is ongoing on storm drains and catch basins in areas where traffic is not traveling. We are also securing the site for upcoming monsoons. We have three more catch basins to install.

Landscape irrigation installation stopped for a week and is picking back up next week.

Street light pole foundations and pole installation have started. TEP will have to change out one large transmission pole on the east side north of Broadway; the swing of the line is too close to the street lights. This will happen in October when their relocation window opens back up. We will continue to work in this area.

As you probably noticed, the rains messed up some of our pre-asphalt grading, but we went out and re-graded, and have continued to try to get as much asphalt down as possible.

We are also going to modify some of our stormwater preventative measures, as we are seeing a lot of undesired results from the rains. Bear with us, as we modify things as mother nature shows us what needs attention.

We will be working with TUSD to make sure that when school starts at the end of this month, we have coordinated their bus routes with our construction. If you have any concerns about parent drop-off access, please let me know.

Broadway Intersection Park & Ride: Once the contractor submits their final schedule we can issue the notice to proceed. We anticipate that we are days away from this. Once we reach this point, the contractor will be moving their field office and staging area to its new location at the Houghton and 22nd Street intersection. They are still trying to decide if it will be at the southeast or southwest corner of that intersection. It is estimated that this work will take about four months. It appears that the small building that will be part of the Park & Ride (for bus drivers), has a long lead time for ordering, so that may come in shortly after we complete the Park & Ride.

Broadway Boulevard to 22nd Street: The Broadway to 22nd segment utility relocation is in progress, and full construction is anticipated to start in late July or August. This should be an 18-month construction process.

Team Fischel is relocating for Southwest Gas, and they are about 70% complete.

Tucson Electric Power and TriCon are relocating for TEP. They are 100% complete on their transmission line relocations, 80% complete on the distribution lines, and 20% complete with their underground work.

Kleven is relocating for CenturyLink. They are 100% complete on placing conduit and pulling cable, and 40% complete with splicing. They have added additional splicers for this work to keep it moving forward.

Time Warner was out this week adjusting their lines to make sure they are compatible with the new project.

All barricading for utility relocations has been coordinated with our contractor, Borderland Construction, to keep traffic moving smoothly and with the least amount of confusion possible. We have asked utilities to be diligent with their dust control, and keeping their sites clean.

The artists for this project have been selected. We are waiting for all the final approvals (several months), and once the artists have their notice to proceed, we will schedule a meeting for you to meet them and share ideas. There are numerous possible locations for art throughout this project area.
