Remember to bring your own container to bring home woodchips that can be used in your garden. Please remember to remove all ornaments, decorations and tree stands before dropping off at the TreeCycle sites.

'Tis the season for many of us to get packages in the mail. In those packages we usually find styrofoam packing peanuts, lots of them. Many of the materials they are manufactured from are not made of easily biodegradable material.

Fortunately, there is a way to keep them out of our landfills and waste stream. According to the City's Environmental Services Department, many shipping and packing stores

will take used peanuts and reuse them for new shipments. Call your local shipping and packing store first to find out if they take them.

Also, used packing peanuts can be taken to Suburban Miners, 3959 E. Speedway, Building #305, Monday thru Friday between 9 and 5. They also accept used electronics and scrap metal.
