They have a very comprehensive catalog that has 45 categories and over 300 local eco-friendly businesses, non-profit orgs and programs and additional resources for you to use. There are also services that offer a drop-off point for select recyclable and reusable materials, some even offer used merchandise for resale, or provide other products and services that are environmentally friendly.



The Recycling Directory also lists which businesses and programs are TCB members and partners in support of the organization's environmental education efforts. Some of the listed companies also provide TCB members with special discounts on products and services. Fabulous!

If you have a company or organization offering recycling, reuse or other environment-friendly materials and services, then list it into the Recycling Directory. Business and organizations can request a listing by filling out and returning a "Listing Request Form," which can be found on TCB's website under "Recycling Directory." WATTS

The Western Army National Guard Aviation Training Site, (WAATS) is located at the Silverbell Army Heliport Marana.



The WAATS is the premier training site for attack and aero-scout helicopter training for the Army National Guard. The training site also serves both active duty and National Guard aviators with simulation support, utilizing the AH-1 Flight Weapons Simulator or the AH-64 Combat Mission Simulator. Helicopter emergency procedures training is being conducted at the Picacho Stage field, which has a control tower, crash fire rescue and four emergency procedure-training lanes. In addition, Picacho Stage field is able to bivouac an entire Apache battalion. The training environment of the WAATS is second to none. Weather and flying conditions allow for 360 training days per year. The sparsely populated low level and tactical training area has 3600 square miles, 2/3 of which has been approved for tactical landing zones. In addition, the training area has 8 commercial instrumented airports.

The Singapore Air Force also trains with U.S. pilots at Silverbell's Peace Vanguard Detachment. Flying units at Silverbell support joint training requirements with units at Davis-Monthan, Fort Huachuca, MCAS Yuma, and Nellis Air Force Base, Nev.

Houghton Road: Irvington to Valencia

Final striping in progress:

The final striping started last night with the additions of arrows, "ONLY"s, and bike path striping.

This final striping work will be done at night, from 8 PM to 4 AM, utilizing flashing arrow boards and an off-duty police officer, following this schedule:

1. Wednesday, June 4- Marking intersections/cross walks
2. Thursday, June 5- Same as Wednesday
3. Sunday, June 5 through Wednesday June 11 (times indicated above) - mainline striping
4. Thursday, June 12- 8 PM to 12 AM- Mainline striping

All landscaping and hydro-seeding is complete. The sign subcontractor lost a few days in his schedule because of last week's winds, and is working toward a completion date of June 11. As always, please keep the speeds down for a short time longer, we are almost done!

****The ribbon cutting to celebrate completion of this project has been scheduled for Tuesday, June 24 at 9:00 a.m. We are still working on the location, and will send out details once that is arranged. We look forward to seeing you at our event.****

Houghton Road: Future projects

The Regional Transportation Authority has secured additional bond funding, and the City of Tucson has requested funding to complete the work in the following areas:

- Houghton Road: 22nd Street to Irvington Road
- Houghton Road: Valencia Road to Old Vail/Mary Ann Cleveland Way

Our goal is to start design and construction of these segments in April 2015 with the following timelines: Design: 18 months, Right of way acquisition: 18 months, Utility relocations: 8 months, and Construction: 18 months.

We will let you know what funding we receive, and how we will move forward from there. We appreciate your patience, and we want to hear from you if you have any questions, concerns or suggestions.
